ANNUAL MEETING IN LIMA, PERU – TRAVEL TIPS

We are experiencing a record number of early registrations to the meeting in Peru. This good news seems to indicate a great interest in our annual meeting. Peru is a wonderful country, with plenty for all of us to visit and enjoy. We recommend you consider a few days before or after the meeting as a vacation time, to go around the country, or even stay in Lima, and get to know that beautiful nation a little better.

As you get ready to come, here are some good tips on flights:

a. Lima receives direct flights from the following places:

Europe: London (about to begin with British Airways), Amsterdam, Madrid, Paris and Frankfurt (Air Europe). **North America**: Mexico City, Toronto, New York, Washington, Miami, Dallas, Houston, Newark, Atlanta and Los Angeles.

Central and South America: Virtually all major capitals and cities. Brazil has direct flights from Rio, Brasilia and Sao Paulo.

b. Other Continents and Connecting Flights:

Asia: There are several good options for those coming from Asia: 1. Connecitng in Europe, in one of the airports listed above; 2. connect in one of the US airports with direct flights to Lima – Los Angeles is a very good option, with 5 flights to Lima per day; fly via Dubai or Abu Dhabi to Sao Paulo, Rio, Panama City or Bogota, and connect to Lima;

Oceania: Use one or the US or Europe cities with direct flights, or fly via Qantas from Sydney to Santiago, Chile, connecting to Lima. (this is, by far, the shortest route).

Africa: There are several direct flights to Brazil, with easy connections to Lima (only a four hours flight from Rio or Sao Paulo to Lima). Addis, Luanda and Johannesburg,. You can also use any connection in Europe or North America to reach Lima. Coming through Brazil is the most saving time option. Johannesburg or Addis flights are only seven hours to Rio or Sao Paulo. From Brazil to Lima is an additional four hours flight.

TABLE OF SENIOR PASTORS

Brazilian Regional Chapter: The Brazilian Chapter met in Salvador, Bahia, on August 22-24. Pastor Milton, from First Baptist Church in that city was our host. 120 participants attended the gathering. Pastor Charles Price, from Toronto, and himself a member of the Senior Pastors Global Table, attended the meeting with his wife Hillary, and brought two beautiful and blessed devotionals.







REFUGEE INITIATIVE

GKPN continues with its effort to help churches in the Mid-East and Europe to reach out to refugees and internally displaced people. We thank you all for your engagement in this crucial initiative.

After our GKPN Gathering in Lisbon, where we heard about the tremendous need of the Syrian refugees in Europe, an idea was formulated to send Arabic speaking Christians to work with the churches in Europe reaching these people.

The first groups have already gone and are experiencing great success, including conversions and baptisms. Pastor Peter Wenz told us that the 5 volunteers he received have achieved remarkable results in less than a month of work.

We now have many churches asking for Arabic speaking volunteers, but have been encountering some visa problems, particularly for those volunteering from Egypt. It would be easier for volunteers from countries where there are no, or minimal, visa requirements for Europe to send workers.

Part of the agreement with the local church is that they provide accommodation for the volunteers but airfares and food are down to the sponsoring group.

This project is showing great fruit and is an opportunity that exists NOW, but may not exist once all of the refugees have been settled.

Conesul Chapter

GLOBAL YOUTH MOVEMENT

The excitement is growing with this important initiative of the GKPN. Here are some of the good news coming out of the movement:

Regional Chapters

So far, this year has seen wonderful chapter meetings for the Global Youth Movement. Here are some of the details:

Mid-East Chapter. The group met at Beit el Wadi, Egypt, on March 1-3, with participants from Syria, Algeria, Emirates, Jordan, Lebanon, Iraq, Yemen and Egypt. The meeting was very inspiring and fruitful. Pastor Sameh Maurice was the host pastor.

European Chapter: The group met at Word of Life Church, in Upsala, Sweden, on April 26-28. There were leaders from Sweden, Germany, France, Scotland, Portugal, Ukraine, Switzerland and Finland in attendance. The group decided to create another Chapter and call it East Europe Chapter. Pastor Joakim Ludviquist was the host pastor. There will be a planning meeting for the East Europe Chapter on November 10, in Kiev, Ukraine.

East Africa Chapter: The group met in Kampala, Uganda, with participants from Uganda, Burundi, Rwanda, Kenya, South Sudan. The chapter will meet again in 2017, in Kigali, Rwanda. Pastor Gary Skinner was the host pastor.

Latino Chapter: The group met in San Jose, Costa Rica, with participants from Dominican Republic, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Mexico, USA, Argentina, Peru, Colombia and Ecuador. The meeting was a grat blessing. Pastor Hugo Solis and Pastor Cash Luna were the host pastors. The group decided to start regional chapters in all the countries represented at the meeting. These new chapters will involve at least 910 youth pastors.

Brazilian Chapter: The Brazilian Chapter is meeting this coming November 14-16, in Ribeirão Preto, SP. There will be 150 atendees from 20 states in the country, each leading at least 500 500 youths.

Regional Congresses

Mid-East Youth Leaders Congress: This second congress for the youth leaders happened on March 4-5, in Beit el Wadi, Egypt. Pastor Sameh, as he normally does, served as the host pastor. Aziz and Nader were the local host youth pastors. 750 leaders came from eight Mid-East nations. Great blessing, indeed.

Brazilian Congress: Up to 3,500 youth leaders met in Curitiba. The meeting happened at the facilities of First Baptist Church. Pastor Pascoal Piragine was our host pastor. Michael and Lucas, local youth pastors, served as youth hosts. The group decided to have two congresses in July 2017. One will be for the North-Northeast part of
